CACHE will be hosting a double art exhibit reception on Saturday, August 2, at 4:30 PM. In our main gallery space we will feature *Sights and Sounds*, a duo artist exhibition and live music event with Heidi Steinman and Aaron Gomes. In our hallway gallery, the work of sculptor Edward Dobson will be on view.

Steinman was born and raised in Visalia, California, and discovered her love for painting in the first grade. She took her first oil painting class in 2003 at Redwood High School and additional classes at the College of the Sequoias. Her

work reflects the natural world in color-rich paintings that are inspired by her hometown and nature walks. The rewarding process of creating art is a way for her to find healing and solace and to connect with God.

Gomes's minimalist painted line art utilizes black India ink on a white gesso background to produce a clean, stark appearance. This "language of lines" is then coupled with stringed instrument performances that create a multisensory experience for the audience.

Dobson earned his master's in art at Arizona State University, where he specialized in sculpture. His work is located in many private collections around the country. He began his career as a college art teacher at Colorado Women's College in Denver before moving to Utah State University and settling into a twenty-year role at Grossmont Community College in San Diego.

Board president Dwight Miller's upcoming talk is titled Parades, Pageants, and Picnics: Exeter's History of Festivals from 1908.


